Week 3 | Open Houses and Pop Ups

Residents, business owners, developers, and members of the Atlanta community will learn ways to participate in the city planning process during the first round of 'Plan A' public meetings. Attendees can provide input on Atlanta's growth and development using surveys and an online mapping tool. The first round of the community series takes place citywide from March through April with 12 in-person Open Houses and 8 Pop Ups. Plan A is the 5-year update to the City's Comprehensive Development Plan (CDP) and it sets forth the vision, goals, policies, and actions for future physical growth and development in Atlanta. Public input is critical to updating the plan.

For the 3rd week of Open Houses from April 9th – 16th, these are scheduled during the evening at libraries, churches and a city building. Pop Up locations include neighborhood festivals, arts and cultural activities, and leisure events. Pop Up times will vary. 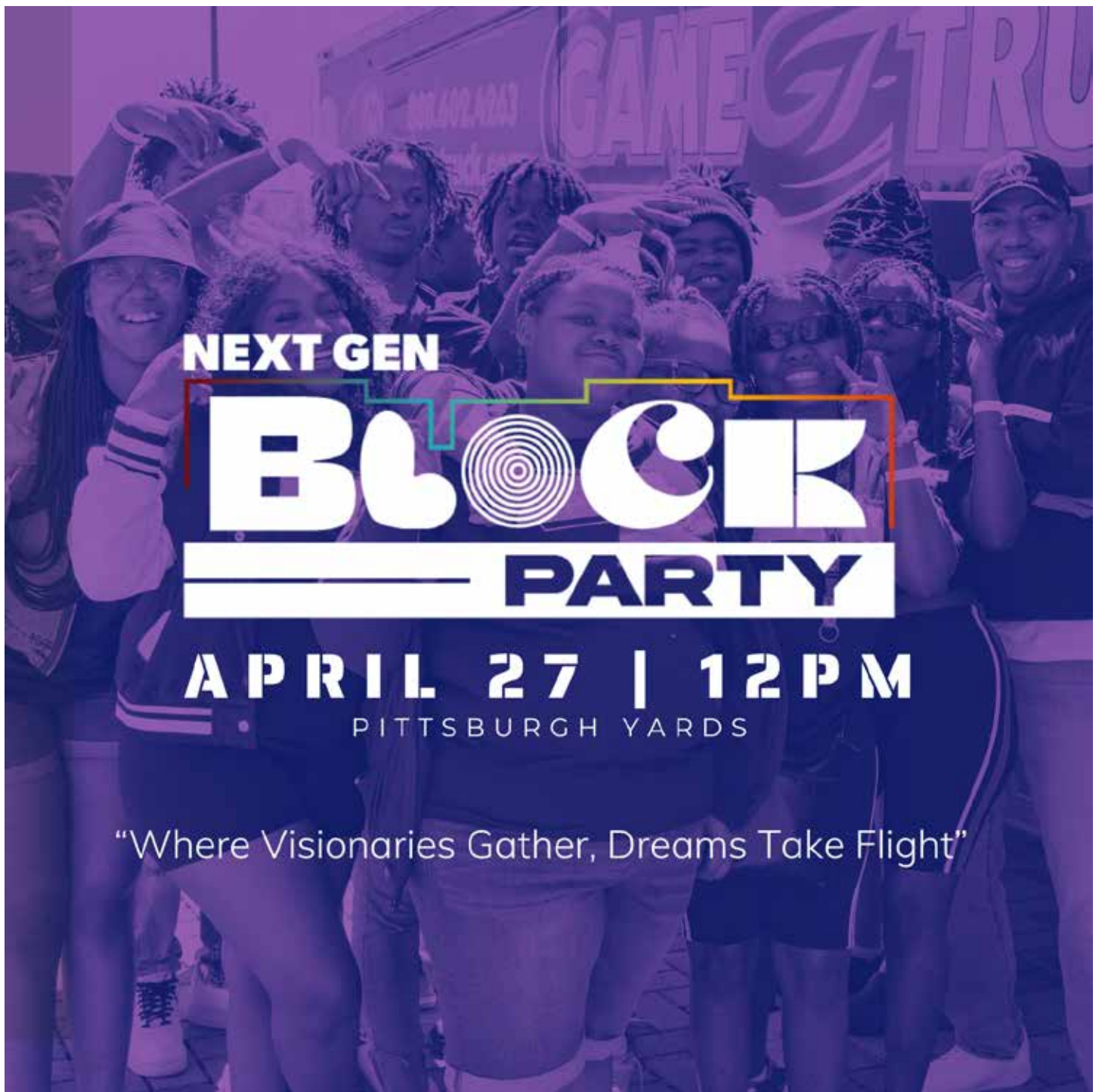

Fulton County seeking students to serve as Youth Commissioners to provide a voice for youth issues

Fulton County wants young people in search of leadership roles to apply to serve as Youth Commissioners. The Fulton County Youth Commission gets tomorrow's leaders involved today by having its members address the many issues presently facing youth. The Fulton County Department of Community Development is seeking high school students between 9th and 11th grades to participate in the program for the 2024-25 academic year.

The Fulton County Youth Commission focus on many initiatives throughout the year, including:

- Legislation (Mission: The FCYC Legislative Committee focuses on safeguarding the rights and needs of youth in the Atlanta area through engaging with the political process)**
- Health (Mission: Increase health access for our fellow youth and citizens in Fulton County by providing workshops that focus on prevention and intervention of drug use)**
- Environmental (Mission: Promote a “green” mindset and raise awareness for environmental issues and immediate solutions in Fulton County)**
- Social Progress (Mission: Promote a strong community and raise awareness for societal concerns while advocating for solutions within Fulton County)**
- And Community Projects (such as assisting during Commissioner Hall’s Youth Conferences, hosting toy donation drives, and The Summer of Peace Tour)**

This year the Youth Commissioners participated in the 2024 Fulton County Point in Time Count initiative on January 24, 2024 and Youth Commission Day at the Georgia State Capitol on February 21, 2024. One Youth Commission member, Nathaniel D’Silva was selected to speak before the House Judiciary Committee during their meeting on HB 1296 (online internet safety) and the Senate Education Subcommittee on Senate Bill 351 (Protecting Georgia's Children on Social Media Act of 2024). The Fulton County Youth Commission is heavily involved in making the County great for youth and we strongly encourage eligible applicants to apply.

Construction of the Fulton County Behavioral Health Crisis Center is Underway


The Oak Hill Child, Family & Adolescent Center, located at 2805 Metropolitan Pkwy SW, Atlanta, GA 30315 has allocated a portion of the 48,000-square-foot facility to serve as the Behavioral Health Crisis Center, which will provide behavioral health crisis services 24 hours a day, seven days a week through a 24-bed, 16-observation chair center.

Through a \$5.6 million dollar commitment from the State, and a \$15 million commitment from Fulton County, the Fulton County Behavioral Health Crisis Center is on track to open in Spring of 2024.


In addition to the Behavioral Health Crisis Center, the Fulton County Health &

Human Services at Oak Hill campus will continue to offer a public health clinic operated by the Fulton County Board of Health. In addition, partner agencies will continue to offer other safety net services addressing food security and other community needs.

The Fulton County BHCC will offer 24 beds, 16 chairs and a Living Room Intake Model with peer support.

State Commitment




An initial \$5.6 Million in operational funding was included in the FY24 GA DBHDD Budget. An additional \$5.6 Million is included in the FY25 passed by the House. (\$1.8M increase from Governor's proposed FY25 budget)

Fulton County's Commitment




Fulton County has invested \$15 million in renovations for the BHCC, and has provided use of the Fulton County Health & Human Services Campus at Oak Hill


Operator Model






Grady Health system has been selected as operator for the Fulton County BHCC, an expansion of their longstanding partnership with Fulton County.



In addition to the Behavioral Health Crisis Center, the Fulton County Health & Human Services at Oak Hill campus will continue to offer a public health clinic operated by the Fulton County Board of Health. In addition, partner agencies will continue to offer other safety net services addressing food security and other community needs.



The BHCC campus will offer outpatient behavioral health services through the Fulton County Behavioral Health Network, funded through the Fulton County General Fund.
