What IDs can I use?

- Any valid state, federal, or tribal government-issued photo
- GA Driver's License, even if expired
- Student ID from GA public College or University

- Valid employee ID from any federal or Georgia state or local government entity
- Valid U.S. Passport
- Valid U.S. Military ID (with photo)

What if I don't have one of these IDs?

Know Your Rights!

- Vote if you are in line when polls close at 7 p.m.
- Vote free from intimidation.
- Vote and cast a regular ballot even if you are on the "inactive voters" list. In fact, voting is one of the ways to return to active status.
- Ask to vote by a provisional ballot if there is uncertainty regarding your registration status or eligibility.
- Avoid waiting in line. If you are 75 years of age or older or have a disability and you are at your polling place between 9,30 a.m. and 4:30 p.m., you will not be required to wait in line. Tell a poll worker if you want to move to the front of the line. For information on the accessibility of your polling place, please contact your county elections office.
- Receive assistance when voting if you are unable to vote unaided due to blindness, disability, illiteracy, or difficulty reading English. You can choose who assists you, as long as they are not your employer, union representative, or candidate on the ballot or their close relative (if candidate not closely related to voter).
- Vote after serving a felony conviction if you have completed your entire sentence, including probation or parole. The right to vote is automatically restored once the sentence is complete, if you re-register before October 7. The right to vote is not lost by a conviction under the first offender act or a conditional discharge sentence.
